**Page 1.** Picture of Band-i Amir: An area located in the province of Bamyan.  
Photo text in Dari:

"I will give you a new heart and put a new spirit in you; I will remove from you your heart of stone and give you a heart of flesh." (Ezekiel 36:26)

Inset text in Pashto (next to the small photo of a farmer working in Baghlan province, in a blue-coloured box):

"A new life with God is like a rebirth; An opportunity to review yourself and choose a new and clear path that is accompanied by His love and guidance"

**Page 2.** Picture of Kabul

Photo text in Pashto:
